My thanks to Past President, Steve Pyrak, for a job well done. I presented District Director Citations for outstanding service for 2002 to Peg Newill and George Meiling. Congratulations Peg and George, and thank you for the outstanding job you did in 2002.

Consulting Rosarian Chair, Steve Pyrak recently held a very successful CR Audit and

School in Toledo. 35 area master gardeners along with a number of Buckeye Rosarians participated in the school. Horticulture Judges Chair, Dr. Jim Hering reports that Betty Packard has requested a change from active to emeritus status. I remember apprenticing with Betty many years ago, her knowledge of Old Garden Roses was

amazing to me. Thank you, Betty, for many years of service.

The Fall ARS Convention and Rose Show was held in Philadelphia, PA in September. It was a good meeting and I was happy to see so many Buckeye rosarians attending. At the Board of Director's business meeting a number of items were discussed and approved. They include: 1) An earlier action taken in San Jose to phase out the four ARS "specialty" bulletins was rescinded; 2) Effective January, 2003, fees for judging schools will be raised to \$50; 3) Archie Snedegar will serve as consultant for the gift shop operations; 4) An optional continuing education credit system for Consulting Rosarian recertification was adopted; 5) The CR recertification period was changed from three to four years; 6) The *Guidelines For Judging Roses* will be incorporated into the *Official List of Approved Exhibition Names for Exhibitors and Judges*.

Also at the board meeting the 2003 Home Depot contract was approved and signed. By now, local society presidents should have received a letter from ARS President, Dr. Tommy Cairns, explaining the project and asking for support. Local societies are asked to designate a coordinator to work with District CR Chair, Steve Pyrak. All rosarians are encouraged to participate in this project, and build upon the relationships established last year. Our goal is to exceed the 19 seminars held in the Buckeye District in 2002. With your help, we can easily accomplish this goal.

The final 2002 issue of *The Buckeye Rose Bulletin* will be devoted to the "Year of the Rose – 2002". Please submit stories, pictures, thoughts, activities list, etc. to Editor Randy Lady by December 13, 2002. In particular, we are looking for a list of Buckeye rose cities,

public garden dedications, programs with children, library displays, veteran's programs, or any other local society special activity. This will be our last chance to celebrate the "Year of the Rose" and acknowledge those who participated.

The Buckeye District lost three great rosarians recently when Dr. Charles Beutel, Jack Brenner and Catherine Lies passed away. Dr. Beutel, formerly of Ravenna, was a Consulting Rosarian, exhibitor and lecturer. Jack Brenner, a member of the Greene County Rose Society, lived in Xenia, and became a Consulting Rosarian in 1989. Catherine Lies, of Akron, an avid exhibitor, served as a horticulture judge for many years. Their willingness to help others and their passion for roses will be missed by all.

Looking ahead, the district has a number of events planned for early 2003. On Saturday, February 8, 2003, CR Chair, Steve Pyrak is planning a Consulting Rosarian Audit and School in Dayton. A CR Audit is also being planned for April 5th, the day before the Spring District Meeting in Columbus at the Franklin Park Conservatory. Are Roses Hard to Grow?

“Roses are hard to grow.” “I don’t have the time to grow roses.” “Roses always die for me.” These are the usual responses from people when ask about growing roses. Sometimes I think they may be right. That is, when I walk by the Daylillies planted in clay and the hosta that require almost no attention. But, daylillies aren’t that appealing and hostas, well they’re just big leaves. With these responses in mind, I decided to see how easy and simple roses could be grown.

I first set my goals, 10 roses being grown with off the shelf products available to anyone with the least amount of effort. So what kind of roses? Of course everyone wants hybrid teas. Isn’t it nice how we rosarians and garden centers recommend and sell hybrid teas roses to amateurs. The most difficult to grow roses available and we give them to someone who has never grown anything in their life! If the soil, planting, watering, or pests don’t kill it the first year, winter will. Shrubs would be a good recommendation if planting in the ground. Some of the modern and David Austin shrubs are the easiest, hardiest and best blooming roses available. However if we want to make this easy, let’s put our roses in pots. No digging up the ground, mixing with packaged soils, and worrying about drainage. Pots allow you to control the complete soil environment with water drainage. So shrubs are out of the questions, a pot large enough would have to be moved with a crane! So this leaves us with miniatures, and to not upset some of the breeders, this includes mini-floras.

The only problem, miniature roses are not easy to buy at your local garden center. Many local rose societies sell miniature roses for fund raising activity. This is a good way to get your miniatures. It’s a shame we can’t get more garden centers to carry quality and more recent varieties. Great advances in miniature and mini-flora rose culture has occurred in the past 15

years. Of course, most nurseries will sell miniature roses over the phone with delivery according to your climate.

So I ordered 10 miniatures from our local club, less than \$5.00 each. What varieties do you buy? I went with ones that grow well in the ground and are proven for our climate, two each of Fairhope, Chelsea Belle, Hot Tamale, Rainbow’s End, and Kristin.

The pots, soil and fertilizer can from a national home and garden store. I bought 17-inch pots, which translate into about 5 to 6 gallon at \$7.97 each. Miracle Grow potting mix was purchased at \$8.88 for 2 cubic feet, which fills up 2 pots. The potting mix was used 100% in the pots. Make sure you have some drain holes in the bottom of the pots. The pots I bought also have a pan they set in that helps keep some water in the bottom of the pots. The pots should be filled about 2 inches from the top, they will settle a bit and you need room for mulch and watering.

For fertilizer I went with 6-month slow release pellets available under a variety of brand names. Often they have a mixture recommended for roses, which is fine. I added this when I planted and none the rest of the year.

I planted the mini roses in the potting mix slightly deeper than planted in the pots. I also slightly loosened the dirt in the pot with the young roots. Of course after planting, water well. The new potting mix will take a lot of water so take your time.

For pest control, I immediately starting using either the Ortho or Specticide aerosol premixed spray. This is probably the easiest, general-purpose material to use for pest control. I decided not to use the organic type materials such as Safer products, maybe next year. My plan is to use this on a weekly basis and nothing else for pests.

So I have my roses planted and now all I have to do is water as needed, spray once a week, and watch them grow! They also are place where there is sunlight all day, no shade.

We had a wet spring and the roses grew well, some faster than others but all did well. After one month they were all at least 10 to 12 inches tall with buds getting ready to open.

After 2 months the Hot Tamale and Chelsea Belle were taking off, probably a good 18 inches tall. The others weren't growing as quick. Part of this could be due to the dry summer. We watered the pots every evening due to the extremely dry conditions.

After 3 months the Hot Tamale and Chelsea Belle had at least a dozen blooms at all time on each bush. The other plant had some blooms but not as vigorous. The Fairhope had nice blooms, but not many. The Kristin had a few more blooms but they were not very well formed and a little small. Same with the Rainbow's End.

The three varieties that didn't grow quite as well also had a tendency to get blackspot, even with the weekly spraying. I'm not sure if this is due to the plants not being as large and healthy, or from the variety. All do well in the ground when sprayed with stronger pesticides. In August and September when conditions are

right for blackspot, these three got it fairly bad. The Hot Tamale and Chelsea Belle had slight blackspot. Insects weren't a problem on any of the varieties.

So my conclusion, the right miniature roses can be grown with minimal care and time while giving constant blooms and a healthy plant. An initial investment of less than \$20 per plant will get you started. I would recommend Hot Tamale and Chelsea Belle for pots and they require very little maintenance. Watering on a daily basis and once a week spraying should take care of maintenance. Once a season slow release fertilizer should take care of feeding.

What's next? The Kristin and Fairhope will be planted in our mini rose bed, we can always use more exhibition roses. The others will be protected for the winter and we'll see how they do next year. For winter protection, I'm going to mound up mulch in the pots, cover in a large, dark plastic trash bag and move to the east side of house, outside of the garage. I'm not putting them into the garage since it might get too warm. I do need to remember to give them water the first of each month.

Next year I'm getting some new varieties, which will include some of the new mini florals. I think they may be well suited for pots and some grow like small hybrid teas. I'm getting closer to saying "Roses are easy to grow and don't take a lot of time".

Betty Packard has requested a change from accredited to emeritus status, and this has been approved by ARS. Thank you Betty for

many years of service to the Buckeye District. We now have fifty two (52) accredited hort. Judges and eight (8) emeritus judges.

We are always in need of more judges. In order to fulfill this need, we will be holding a horticulture judging school in conjunction with the Great Lakes District at the combined Buckeye/Great Lakes District Conference and Rose Show in Toledo on September 13 & 14, 2003. The school will run from 10:30 am to 5:00 pm on Saturday and from 9:00 am til Noon on Sunday. This schedule will allow judging candidates to exhibit in the rose show. You are required to have been an ARS member for the past three years to be a candidate, but anyone can audit the school. The registration fee for candidates is \$35.00 and \$10.00 for others auditing the school. Accredited judges can fulfill their four-year seminar requirement by attending the school from 1:00 pm til 5:00 pm Saturday at no charge.

At the 2002 Buckeye District Conference in Marion in September, the district's highest judging honor, the Outstanding Judge Award, was bestowed upon Art Sparks.

Congratulations Art: the district is indebted to you for many years of quality judging.

It is time to submit your annual judges report form to me. Remember, it is required in order to maintain your accreditation. A form is attached to this Bulletin.

International Rose Trials are held annually throughout Europe (20 locations) from Barcelona to Glasgow and from Paris to Czechoslovakia. New rose introductions are judged by panels of international "jurors" (judges) like you and me. Two year old bushes are evaluated in the gardens, and the criteria used are quite different than our judging "guidelines" for rose shows. The criteria are:

1. Growth, habit and foliage
2. Resistance to disease
3. Abundance of blooms and succession of blooming
4. Stem, shape of bud and shape of rose
5. Degree of novelty and color of the flower
6. Fragrance

Judging in Europe is very enjoyable as well as educational, and all of the trials are

looking for American judges to participate. I would enjoy giving a program to your local society about the European trials.
