The district Outstanding Judges Award was won by Jim Wickert and the Outstanding Consulting Rosarian Award went to Peg Newill. Congratulations to each of these deserving Buckeye Rosarians. Also at the banquet, I presented the District Director Citations for outstanding service for 2003 to Past District Secretary, Denise Mraz; Past Consulting Rosarian Chairman, Steve Pyrak; and members of the Toledo Rose Society.

Hering, Arrangements – Dr. Gary Barlow, Bulletin Editor/ Website – Randy Lady, Roses in Review – Mark and Marie Jones, Membership – Brian Burley, Local Society Relations – Cheryl Menard and Youth Advisor – Mary Kay Burgess. My thanks to Past President, Jim Zimmerman and Past Roses in Review Chairman, Stuart Schulman, for a job well done. Also at the business meeting, members voted to donate \$1500 to the ARS Klima Capital Campaign Fund.

Dr. Jim Hering with co-chair Jon Wier held a very successful horticulture judging school at the district meeting. As a result, we are proud to announce the addition of seven new Apprentice Judges: Bruce DeLong, Tom Herr, Marie Jones, Mark Jones, Jeanette Pavuk, Len Pavuk and Larry Schock. Congratulations to each of you, and thank you to Jim and Jon and their assistants, Dr. Gary Barlow, Brian Burley, Dr. Lew Shupe and Lois Wier, for a job well done.

Dr. Hering also reports that three Horticulture Judges have requested a change from active to emeritus status: Dave Edwards, Edna Edwards and Tren Meyer. Thanks to each of them for many years of dedication and service to the Buckeye District.

Those not attending the horticulture judging school were able to meet both judging and consulting rosarian credit requirements by attending various seminars at the district meeting. Thank you to those who participated as speakers and panel members.

On August 2, 2003, the 7th annual Top Gun Meeting was held at the Wegerzyn Horticultural Center in Dayton, OH. A sincere thank you to our weekend hosts, Jim and Barbara Zimmerman and the members of the Miami Valley Rose Society for an outstanding meeting. The meeting actually began on Friday night at the Zimmerman's home with a catered dinner. On Saturday, guest speaker, Jim Mills of Bucatunna, MS presented a program on new roses. Participants then divided into three groups to attend round table discussions led by Jim Zimmerman, Dave Ackers and Dr. Jim Englert. After lunch, Dr. Jim Hering moderated a discussion by Jim Zimmerman, Tim Hartranft, Dr. Paul Klinefelter and Jim Mills on "Babes, Bankers and Heartbreakers". After registrants' testimonials on an impact product or technique, the potted rose auction began. Thank you to everyone who donated roses for the auction. The Buckeye District benefits greatly from your efforts. A special thank you to Dr. Gary Barlow for donating the proceeds from the silent book auction to the Buckeye District.

The Fall ARS Convention and Rose Show was held in Alexandria, VA in September. It was a good meeting and despite the weather, the rose show was stunning. As always, I was happy to see a number of Buckeye rosarians attending the convention. Due to the absence of President Cairns, Marilyn Wellan conducted the Board of Director's business meeting where a number of items were discussed and approved. They included: 1) Best Mini-Flora One-Bloom-Per-Stem and Best Mini-Flora Spray certificates were approved and will be available in Spring, 2004; 2) National Rose Show Queen and Miniature Queen certificates, signed by ARS President were

approved; 3) Rose Mall proposals to continue with no major changes were approved; 4) Future convention sites approved: Memphis, TN – Fall 2005, St. Paul, MN – Spring, 2007; 5) *Guidelines and Rules for Judging Roses* is near completion, and 6) Benny Ellerbe will take over the duties of ARS Executive Director beginning January 1, 2004.

On October 11, 2003, Consulting Rosarian Chair Tom Wood, with the assistance of Past CR Chair Steve Pyrak, held a CR Audit and School in Cincinnati. As a result, two more Consulting Rosarians were added to the Buckeye list: Clarence McLain and Carol McLain. Congratulations to both of you and thank you to faculty members Steve Pyrak, Tom Wood, Ben Browning, Jerry Dolph, Randy Lady and myself.

Local Societies wishing to present the District Bronze Medal for Outstanding Service, should contact me for an application form. The fee for the District award is \$10, accompanied by the completed form. Societies have the option of awarding the medal annually or only on occasion to a deserving individual for outstanding service to the society or area. This award should not be confused with the ARS Bronze Medal Award that is ordered directly from ARS headquarters.

The Buckeye District lost a number of great rosarians in recent months when Dan Lazor (Williamsfield), Dick Seibold (Columbus), Paul Berns (Canton) and Scott Bailey (Oberlin) passed away. Our condolences go out to their loved ones. All will miss their passion for roses and their willingness to assist others.

Looking ahead, the district has a number of events planned for early 2004. Due to Easter, the Spring District Meeting will be held earlier this year on Sunday, March 21, 2004. Once again, the meeting will be held at Franklin Park Conservatory in Columbus. On Saturday, the day before the district meeting, Dr. Jim Hering

is planning a Horticulture Judges Seminar. Also, CR Chair Tom Wood is planning a Consulting Rosarian Audit and School on April 24, 2004, in Youngstown. Look for details concerning these and future events in *The Buckeye Rose Bulletin* or on the district website: www.buckeyeroses.com.

Buckeye Judges' Corner

The Buckeye District Outstanding Judge Award for 2003 was announced at the District Convention in Toledo, September 14th. The honoree is Jim Wickert from Cleveland Heights. Jim was unable to attend the convention, so I will present the award to him at the Cleveland Rose Society meeting on November 4th. Congratulate Jim when you see him.

Three of our long-standing horticulture judges, Dave and Edna Edwards and Tren Meyer, have requested emeritus judge status, which means they will no longer be participating as active judges. The District is indebted to them for their many years of faithful service and will miss their judging camaraderie and expertise.

As judges accept emeritus status, the ranks of accredited judges available to judge our local shows are thinned. The Buckeye District now has 48 accredited horticulture judges but needs more. A horticulture judging school was held at the district meeting on September 14th and 15th to train new judges. Eight of our fellow district rosarians attended the school (as well as four candidates from other districts) and took the examination. The following are now officially Apprentice Judges: Bruce DeLong, Tom Herr, Marie Jones, Mark Jones, Jeanette Pavuk, Len Pavuk and Larry Schock. Congratulations to each of you. Please invite them to judge your local shows next year so that they can complete their requirements and become accredited.

Jon Wier (Great Lakes District) co-chaired the school with me; Lois Wier (GL), Gary Barlow, Lew Shupe and Brian Burley served as instructors; and Anne Hering, Rose Enders (GL), Jeanette Farry, Cathy Pruden, Jack Kuzma, Terri Lady, Randy Lady, Jeff Sommer and Tom Rubins acted as school coordinators. I want to thank each of you – your efforts resulted in an excellent school.

In addition to the judging school, a judging seminar was conducted at the district meeting. Eighteen Buckeye judges received seminar credit. I wish to express my appreciation to the following lecturers and panel members who participated in the seminar: Rick Robertson (DS), Art Oberlin (GL), Tom Taylor (GL), Monty Justice (Ten), Jim Zimmerman, Dave Ackers, Gary Rankin (Col) and Monica Valentovic (Col).

Each judge is required to attend at least one seminar every four years to maintain accreditation. The year by which you need to attend a seminar follows your name on the judges' list included with this *Bulletin*. There will be another Buckeye horticulture judging seminar next spring, the day before the district spring meeting. The seminar will thoroughly cover the new *Guidelines and Rules for Judging Roses*, which should be available from ARS by the first of the year. The new National Chairman of Horticulture Judges (for the next three years) is Jeff Wyckoff from Seattle.

A Look at the Buckeye District Perpetual Trophies

American Rose Society J. Horace McFarland Memorial Trophy

This trophy is awarded for an entry of six (6) different Hybrid Tea roses at exhibition stage, one bloom per stem, each in a separate container.

The award honors Dr. J. Horace McFarland, President of the American Rose Society, 1930-1932. He was the editor of ARS publications for 29 years and published the first *Modern Roses* in 1930. Dr. McFarland was recognized

for his contributions to the American Rose Society in 1930 with the Gold Honor Medal and designation as President Emeritus. The ARS Board of Directors created the award in 1949. A national award is competed for annually in each fall American Rose Society National Rose Show. Each district of the ARS has a similar, though smaller, bronze plaque with a sculptured relief of Dr. McFarland. It was first placed in competition in 1951.

Harold H. Allen Memorial Trophy

This trophy is awarded for an entry of five (5) different Hybrid Tea roses at exhibition stage, one bloom per stem, each in a separate container.

Harold H. Allen was a resident of Chillicothe, Ohio and served the Buckeye District for many years. He was 1st Vice President in 1952 and 1953, President in 1955 and District Director from 1956 to 1961. During his term as President he announced the creation of the *Buckeye News Bulletin* with Mr. W. A. Ritter of Akron serving as editor. Mr. Allen was awarded the Silver Honor Medal in 1960 and was recognized as the District's Outstanding Consulting Rosarian in 1965.

Buckeye District Past President's Trophy

This trophy is awarded for an entry of three (3) Hybrid Tea roses, one bloom per stem, one red, one white and one blend, in separate containers.

This award honors all the Past Presidents of the Buckeye District.

Consulting Rosarians Trophy

This trophy is awarded for an entry of six (6) Hybrid Tea roses, one bloom per stem, two each of three different cultivars, each in a separate container.

This award honors all the Consulting Rosarians in the Buckeye District.

Harry O'Brien Memorial Trophy

This trophy is awarded for an entry of five (5) different Hybrid Tea roses at exhibition stage, each an All-American Rose Selections winner, one bloom per stem, each in a separate container.

This award was first presented in 1969 and honors Harry O'Brien, the first Director of the

Buckeye District from 1947 to 1952. He was a resident of Columbus, Ohio and a member of the Columbus Rose Club and the Central Ohio Rose Society.

Cecil C. Roach Memorial Trophy

This trophy was originally awarded for an entry of four Hybrid Tea roses of the same or different varieties, in the red color class, each in a separate container. Currently, the trophy is awarded for an entry of three (3) Floribunda sprays, same or different varieties, each in a separate container.

This award honors Cecil C. Roach, who resided at Rocky River, Ohio. He was active in the Buckeye District, serving as 1st Vice President in 1961 and as Secretary in 1962. He was the District's Outstanding Consulting Rosarian in 1966.

Betty Pavey Buckeye Bowl

This trophy is awarded for an entry of four (4) pink or pink blend Hybrid Tea roses at exhibition stage of the same or different varieties or any combination, each in a separate container.

This award was first presented in 1981 and honors Betty Pavey of Xenia, Ohio. Mrs. Pavey served the Buckeye District and the American Rose Society for many years. She held the District offices of 2nd Vice President through President from 1962 to 1964. She was Director of the Buckeye District on two occasions from 1967 to 1970 and from 1979 to 1982. A leader in the advance of arrangements, Mrs. Pavey wrote the book *Say It With Roses* and presented it to the American Rose Society. It was used as a guide in ARS rose shows for many years. In 1971, she was honored with the Silver Honor Medal and the Outstanding Consulting Rosarian awards. In 1978, she was chosen as the District's Outstanding Judge, the first year this award was given. Mrs. Pavey was awarded the

American Rose Society Gold Honor Medal in 1983.

Mull-Pott Pot

This trophy is awarded for an entry of three (3) white Hybrid Tea roses at exhibition stage of the same of different varieties or any combination, one bloom per stem, each in a separate container.

This award was first presented in 1981 and honors two Buckeye District rosarians: Tom Mullarkey and Dr. William Potts Schmidt, both of Cincinnati, Ohio. Both have been active for many years in the Cincinnati Rose Society and the Greater Cincinnati Rose Association. Tom Mullarkey served as Rose Show Chairman for the Buckeye District in 1981. Dr. Potts Schmidt has an extensive and uniquely landscaped rose garden and has hybridized a number of roses.

All-American Rose Selections Trophy

This trophy is awarded for an entry of three (3) Hybrid Tea roses, each an All-American Rose Selections winner, all different one bloom per stem cultivars, each in a separate container.

All-American Rose Selections, Inc. presented this award to the District. All-American Rose Selections provides a test period of two years for roses submitted by hybridizers. Selection as an AARS winner usually means increased sales of the plants to the public. Many of the selections of the years since 1940 are still available for purchase.

Robert E. Lawton Memorial Trophy

This trophy is awarded for an entry of three (3) Hybrid Tea roses of the same variety in three stages of bloom: a bud, an exhibition stage and a full blown, each in separate containers.

This award was first presented in 1981 and honors Robert E. Lawton, who resided in

Cincinnati, Ohio. Mr. Lawton was a member of the Cincinnati Rose Society and served the Buckeye District in early years. Minutes from 1958 report him as "Representative at Large" to the American Rose Society. A national award also honors Robert E. and Mildred Lawton.

American Rose Society Ralph S. Moore Trophy

This trophy is awarded for an entry of seven (7) miniature roses, one bloom per stem, each a different variety, exhibited in separate containers.

This award honors Mr. Ralph S. Moore of Visalia, California. Mr. Moore is founder and operator of Sequoia Nursery/Moore Miniature Roses in Visalia. He has had a significant influence on the development of miniature roses in the United States. His creations may be found in the parentage of many of the roses that we grow and exhibit today. He has been especially influential in moss roses, both miniature and large types. He is an avid supporter of the American Rose Society, contributing plants, money and time to its betterment.

Wenzel Trophy

This trophy is awarded to an entry of one (1) Hybrid Tea specimen and one (1) Miniature specimen, both at exhibition stage, in separate containers. The varieties should be of similar or complementary color.

Fred Wenzel, formerly of Loveland, Ohio, along with his father, presented this award to the Buckeye District in 1996. Mr. Wenzel served the Buckeye District as Secretary from 1980 to 1982, 2nd Vice President in 1983 and 1996, 1st Vice President in 1984 and 1997, and President in 1985. He was named the District's Outstanding Judge in 1994 and was awarded the Silver Honor Medal in 1995. Mr. Wenzel currently resides in Florida.

Herbert W. Bope Memorial Trophy

This trophy is awarded to an entry of one (1) Hybrid Tea, one bloom per stem, disbudded; one (1) Grandiflora, one bloom per stem, disbudded; and one (1) Floribunda spray, one stem with two or more blooms, exhibited in separate containers.

This award honors Herbert W. Bope, of Newark, Ohio. Mr. Bope served the Buckeye District in the offices of 2nd Vice President through President in 1971 to 1973. He was awarded the Silver Honor Medal in 1983 and recognized as the District's Outstanding Consulting Rosarian in 1969. The Herbert W. Bope Memorial Trophy was presented to the Buckeye District in 1998.

American Rose Society Dr. Griffith J. Buck District Trophy

This trophy is awarded to an entry of three (3) Modern Shrubs, a single bloom or spray, each a different variety, in separate containers. This trophy was first awarded in 2003.

This award honors Dr. Griffith J. Buck. During his tenure at Iowa State University, Buck developed more than 85 varieties of roses that were hardy enough to thrive in the Midwest's tough summers and even tougher winters. Hardy to zone 4 or colder, the spreading or upright shrubs are available in many sizes and colors. Currently, an effort is under way to establish a collection of Buck roses at the Reiman Gardens in Ames, Iowa.

Bosley Perpetual Trophy

This trophy is awarded to the "Queen of the Show", Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora, in a District rose show. It will be presented only to winners residing in the Buckeye District.

This award honors Paul Bosley, who resided in Mentor, Ohio. Mr. Bosley was active in the creation of the Buckeye District and minutes reflect he was instrumental in organizing the first meeting of the District. He maintained a nursery in Mentor and sold many roses to Buckeye District members.

Buckeye District Perpetual Arrangement Trophies

Martha & Irwin Jones Trophy

This trophy was originally awarded to the best line-mass arrangement in a District rose show. Currently, it is awarded to the best standard size traditional design arrangement.

The award honors Martha and Irwin Jones, who resided in Pataskala, Ohio. They were long time members of the Central Ohio Rose Society, and Mr. Jones was a member of the Columbus Rose Club. He also served many years as Treasurer of the American Rose Society, and as Chairman of Judges for the Buckeye District. The Jones' were both editors for many years of a garden column published in the *Columbus Dispatch*.

Buckeye District Consulting Rosarian Arrangement Trophy

This trophy is awarded for the best standard size modern design arrangement.

This award honors Consulting Rosarians of the Buckeye District who are also dedicated arrangers.

Buckeye District Director's Oriental Design Trophy

This trophy is awarded for the best standard size design arrangement in the Oriental manner.

This award honors all Buckeye District Director's who are also dedicated arrangers, and was first awarded in 2000.

Marge and Pete Zimmerman Arrangement Trophy

This trophy was originally awarded to the highest point score among miniature arrangements. Currently, it is awarded to the best miniature size traditional design arrangement.

This award honors Margaret and Peter Zimmerman of Fairview Park, Ohio. The Zimmermans served the District for many years and in 1985 both received the District's Outstanding Judges Award. Mr. Zimmerman was named Outstanding Consulting Rosarian in 1994, and received the Silver Honor Medal in 1979. Mrs. Zimmerman was honored with the Silver Honor Medal in 1977.

Buckeye District Miniature Oriental Design Trophy

This trophy is awarded for the best miniature size design arrangement in the Oriental manner.

Paul P. Berns of 1418 32nd St NE, Canton, OH 44714, passed away after a brave battle with cancer on July 2, 2003. He was a retired steelworker; a member of the American Rose Society, 42 years; member of Stark Rose Society, 41 years, often serving as president or vice-president and rose show chairman and a member of the Akron Rose Society, 38 years, currently serving as vice-president. He grew and exhibited roses for over 40 years, was a Life Accredited Horticulture Judge and Life Consulting Rosarian in the Buckeye District, Silver Honor Medal nominee and recipient of the Bronze Medal Award for his many devoted

Robert A. Hatterschide Arrangement Trophy

This trophy is awarded to the design arrangement attaining the highest point score among all arrangements (not including dried arrangements or table exhibitions). In case of a tie, the arrangement judges of the show shall determine the winner. This award was first presented in 1996.

This award honors Robert A. Hatterschide of Cincinnati, Ohio. Mr. Hatterschide, an outstanding arranger, served the District for many years. He was named Outstanding Consulting Rosarian in 1972, received the District's Outstanding Judges Award in 1979. Mr. Hatterschide was honored with the Silver Honor Medal in 1976.

Two additional perpetual trophies, (Miniature Queen of Show and Best Miniature Size Modern Design Arrangement) will be awarded for the first time at the 2004 Fall Convention and Rose Show in Cincinnati, Ohio.
