From the Director...

The Fall Buckeye District Conference and Rose Show was held September 9 – 11, 2005 at the Marriott Hotel in Columbus. My sincere thanks to Chairman, Brian Burley and the members of Central Ohio Rose Society for their efforts. A special thank you also to our honored guest speaker, Jeff Wyckoff of Seattle, WA. In addition to the rose show awards, there were special awards given at the banquet. Each of these awards was presented to a very deserving Buckeye Rosarian. The Silver Honor Medal was awarded to Jim Zimmerman of Englewood. The Buckeye District Outstanding Judges Award was presented to Jerry McCarthy and the Outstanding Consulting Rosarian Award was won by Tom Rubins.

At the Buckeye District Business Meeting, the following officers were approved for the coming year: President – Jerry Dolph, 1st Vice President – Richard Anthony, 2nd Vice President – Len Pavuk, Secretary – Lisa Weber and Treasurer – Lori Hilfer. My thanks to Past President, Bruce DeLong for a job well done. I presented District Director Citations for outstanding service for 2005 to Pat Martinec, Dr. Lew Shupe and the Central Ohio Rose Society. Congratulations and thank you for your continued support of the Buckeye District.

The local society contest winners of the American Rose Society new member campaign were also announced at the business meeting. The Cleveland Rose Society and the Western

Reserve Rose Society tied for third place and will each receive a one year ARS membership for their local society. There was also a tie for second place between the Central Ohio Rose Society and Greene County Rose Society. Each society will receive a \$75 gift certificate good for ARS show supplies. The winner of the contest was the Garden Club of Marion. They are the recipient of an ARS Patron Membership valued at \$100. Thank you to everyone who participated.

Voting members unanimously approved the proposed amendments to the bylaws of the Buckeye District at the business meeting. The proposed amendments were later discussed and approved by the Board of Directors at their meeting in Memphis, TN.

At the recent ARS Fall National Convention in Memphis, I was thrilled to see the names of three Buckeye Rosarians on the trophy table. Pat Martinec won the President's Trophy with a beautiful display of 'Sunset Celebration'. David Ackers had two winning Court of Honor entries with 'Natasha Monet' and 'St. Patrick' as well as the winning floating bowl entry with 'Dublin'. Tim Hartranft also had two winning entries on the Court of Honor with 'Raphaella' and 'Mavrik'. Congratulations to Pat, David and Tim!

At the ARS Board of Director's business meeting a number of items were discussed and

approved. The highlights included: 1) A new ARS credit card, the Affinity Card with U.S. Bank; 2) The proposed records retention policy and the whistleblower policy; 3) The revisions only for the Arrangement Judging Guidelines; 4) The purposed ARS Bylaw revisions; 5) The addition of the Master Rosarian to the CR Manual; 6) A joint WFRS/ARS Convention to be held in Vancouver, Canada in June, 2009; and 7) The Miniature Rose Conference in Charlotte, NC in May, 2007. The board also unanimously selected Buckeye Dr. Jim Hering to serve as ARS President Emeritus. Congratulations to Jim on this most deserving honor. Jim recently served at the interim ARS Executive Director.

The Buckeye District welcomes new ARS Executive Director, Michael Craft. Mr. Craft is retired from Gannett Publishing Company and was the former publisher of the *Shreveport Times*.

The Buckeye District lost a great rosarian recently when Raymond Wickert of Madison passed away. Ray was a founding member of the Northeastern Ohio Rose Society and received the Buckeye District Silver Honor Medal, the Outstanding Judge Award and the Outstanding Consulting Rosarian Award. Our condolences go out to wife Nina, and sons Jim and Chris.

BUCKEYE JUDGES' CORNER

The Buckeye District has lost a dedicated rosarian, Ray Wickert, who died on Thursday, October 13th. Ray received our district's Silver Honor Medal, Outstanding Judge Award and Outstanding Consulting Rosarian Award and during my term as District Director was the Buckeye District Chairman of Horticulture Judges. He was a founding member of the Northeastern Ohio Rose Society. Ray was a delightful company; he always had a smile and a friendly greeting, and he always was a gentleman. He is survived by his wife Nina, whom he married at Versailles, France, in 1945 and sons Jim and Chris.

At the Fall Buckeye District Convention in Columbus two months ago Jerry McCarthy received the District 2005 Outstanding Judge Award. The District and ARS appreciate the dedicated effort which Jerry gives to judging as well as to the Toledo Rose Society and to the ARS Award of Excellence program as supervisor of the trial garden at the Toledo Botanical Garden. Congratulations Jerry and thanks for all you do for ARS.

In the past five months three Buckeye Apprentice Judges, Tom Herr, Larry Schock and Susan Dolph, have become accredited. Congratulations to Tom, Larry and Susan. They are now listed as Accredited Judges in the list of judges which is included in this *Bulletin*.

As you probably know, I have been experimenting with allowing judges to exhibit in rose shows which they are judging. I have done this for six or seven years in Marion and most recently at this year's district show. Of course judges may enter only classes which they are not judging. My reasons for doing this are: 1. to encourage judges to exhibit more often, 2. to increase the number of entries in shows (which are generally becoming smaller), and 3. to allow judges who would rather exhibit than judge to do both. For many years it has appeared that some of our premier exhibitors are not

interested in becoming judges because they prefer the challenge and excitement of exhibiting (eg. Paul, Dave and Tim). This is regrettable because good exhibitors usually make good judges. Fortunately, some of our best exhibitors in the past decade have become judges even though they couldn't do both at the same time (eg. Bob, Jim and Jim). I presented this concept of exhibiting and judging in the same show at the judges' seminar at the ARS National Convention in Memphis this fall. A few societies around the U.S. are trying it, but most of the judges at the meeting were opposed, some strongly. Those opposed argued that other exhibitors would be intimidated even though they know that the judges are not judging their own entries. Another argument was that it is not ethical to have the judges prepping in the same room as the other exhibitors since it will be too tempting for the judges to look at other entries. Let me know how you feel about this issue in the comments section of your annual judges' report.

Finally, a brief report from ARS headquarters in Shreveport. On August 18th, Benny Ellerbe unexpectedly resigned as ARS Executive Director. The Executive Committee asked me to fill in, at my own expense, as the interim Executive Director and as Chairman of the search committee for a new E.D. Although I knew that there were others more qualified to run a business like ARS, I agreed to this short term commitment and flew to Shreveport on Sunday, August 28th as Katrina was about to strike New Orleans. Fortunately, the hurricane completely bypassed Shreveport (not even any rain), but the city was inundated with evacuees.

My first objective was to find a new Executive Director for our Society. Ads were placed in the *Shreveport Times* and on its web site. In addition we advertised in the newsletter of the American Society of Association Executives. Within two weeks we had received 24 resumes

which were reviewed by me and President Marilyn Wellan. We selected seven candidates for interview, and on Monday, September 19th, the interviews were held by President Wellan, Vice President Steve Jones and me. The search committee presented its recommendation to the ARS Board of Directors at the National Convention in Memphis on September 29th, and Michael Craft was approved by the Board as the new ARS Executive Director. Mike is retired from the Gannett Publishing Company and is the former publisher of the *Shreveport Times*. Shreveport is home to Mike and his wife Becky who have a son in college and a daughter in high school. I left the American Rose Center on Saturday, October 8th, and Mike started as our new E.D. on Monday the 10th. Send Mike a card or give him a call welcoming him to ARS. I think we're in good hands.

During my time as interim E.D. I spent four days a week in Shreveport and flew home on weekends to see Anne and, of course, Ohio State football games. On August 30th, my third day at the Center, we had the final walk-through of the Klima Rose Hall (Education and Visitor Center) with the contractor, and ARS took over the building. The Klima Rose Hall is beautiful inside and out, with the Buckeye Garden immediately in front as you approach the building from the entrance gates. We had the ribbon cutting for the Shreveport community on October 21st, at the time of the Wine and Roses fund raising event and the Fall Festival of Roses. I'm sure that you will be impressed with

this asset to ARS and Shreveport when you visit the American Rose Center.

The World Federation of Rose Societies will be holding its triennial convention in Vancouver, B.C., in June, 2009. WFRS would like the convention to be a joint convention with ARS, like we did in Houston in 2000. This would be the spring convention for ARS for that year. As the representative of ARS, I flew to Vancouver on September 21st (at Vancouver Bureau of Tourism's expense) to tour the venue and meet with the Vancouver planning committee. I recommended favorably to the ARS Board in Memphis, and the Board accepted WFRS' invitation. Meeting with rosarians from around the world will be a delightful experience for ARS members, as will be the city of Vancouver and Bucharth Gardens on Vancouver Island.

While in Shreveport, I signed a contract for a new ARS credit card, the Affinity Card with U.S. Bank. ARS' contract with MBNA will expire at the end of December. If you have the ARS MBNA Card, you may continue to use it, but ARS will not receive any royalties. The Affinity Card will have two big advantages over the MBNA Card. First, it offers member rewards such as frequent flyer miles. Second, ARS will receive much greater royalties for your use of the card. And importantly, no annual fee and no increase in interest rates. When you see the ads for the Affinity Card or are solicited, give it due consideration. I'm going to switch from MBNA to Affinity.
