### ***Buckeye District Spring Meeting***

Spring is just around the corner as is the Buckeye District Spring Meeting. We have a full agenda planned for our meeting in Columbus at the Franklin Park Conservatory on Sunday, April 7, 2002. We are privileged to have as our guest speaker, Oline Reynolds, of Bainbridge, GA. Oline, the current Region 3 Director and Chair of the Prizes and Awards Committee, will present "Watching Goodwood Come Alive Again". Dr. Susan Clingenpeel will speak on growing minis in containers and new varieties, in "Pots and What's Hot". Randy Lady will present the results for the district slide show contest, and Dr. Jim Hering will lead a panel discussion on rose culture. Again this year, you will have an opportunity to bid on a rose or two, and Jim Zimmerman will have the newest miniature varieties available for sale. In addition to the events already discussed, the district has a number of "Rosy Events" planned for 2002. The ARS Spring National Convention will be held in San Jose, CA on April 25-29, 2002. The Toledo RS will hold its annual rose show on June 8-9, at the Toledo Botanical Garden. The Western Reserve RS rose show is at Parmatown Mall on June 9. The Columbus Rose Club will hold its rose show during the rose festival at the Columbus Park of Roses on June 15. The Moundbuilders RS rose show is scheduled for June 23 at the Inn at Sharonbrook. The Millstream RS will be our hosts for the Top Gun Meeting on July 27, in Findlay. Bob Martin, editor of the *Rose Exhibitors Forum* and author of a new book, *Showing Good Roses*, will be our featured speaker. Registration information is available elsewhere in this bulletin. Arrangement Chair, Dr. Gary Barlow has reserved August 3, 2002 for an arrangement seminar and workshop. The Ohio State Fair rose show will be held on August 11. Again this year, the Clark County RS rose show will be held at the Heritage Museum on August 25. The Central Ohio RS's Fall Festival of Roses will be held on September 7-8, at the Franklin Park Conservatory. September 7-8 is also the date of the Lancaster RS rose show, and the Greene County RS will host its annual show on the 8<sup>th</sup>. The ARS Fall National Convention will be held in Philadelphia, PA on September 12-16, 2002. The Garden Club of Marion will host the

Buckeye District Fall Meeting and Rose Show on the weekend of September 20-22. Our guest speaker will be ARS Vice President, Marilyn Wellan, from Colfax, LA. The final rose show of the year will be on September 29, hosted by the Miami Valley RS. Consulting Rosarian Chair, Steve Pyrak, is planning another CR school and audit in the Toledo area in November. Details concerning these events can

be found on the district website or in future issues of *The Buckeye Rose Bulletin*.

## Buckeye Judges Corner

The Heritage Rose Seminar, to be held Saturday, April 6<sup>th</sup> at Franklin Park Conservatory in Columbus, will serve as a judging seminar for Buckeye District horticulture judges and will satisfy the four-year judging audit requirement. The seminar will feature a host of knowledgeable old garden rosarians including Oline Reynolds from the Deep South District, Bunny Skran, Henry Rankin and Lois and Jon Wier from the Great Lakes District and Betty Fagerstrom, Jeff Imlay and George Meiling from our own district. Since OGR’s are notoriously one of the most challenging areas for judges, I encourage you to attend even if you are not required to have a seminar this year.

All judges are required to submit an annual report. As of this writing, I have received only half of the Buckeye reports. If you are delinquent, you have recently received a reminder from me – please comply before the spring meeting. On the brighter side, the reports received have included a number of thoughtful and provocative suggestions:

1. Allow judges to exhibit in classes they are not judging.
2. Do not allow judges to exhibit in classes they are not judging because other exhibitors perceive it as unfair.
3. Have multiple judges classes (in addition to HT & Minis).

4. Standardize method of picking courts.
5. Have a written ballot for selection of courts.
6. Standardize show schedules for Buckeye District shows including rules.
7. Open district perpetual trophies (challenge classes) to all ARS members.
8. Allow Grandifloras to be exhibited in all classes calling for Hybrid Teas (e.g. McFarland).
9. Combine Grandiflora and Hybrid Tea spray classes to become HT/Gr spray class.
10. Establish courts for Floribunda and Miniflora classes.
11. Establish a class for buds.
12. Show schedules to specify the location in mall where the rose show is being held.
13. Provide for judges reports to be submitted electronically.
14. Establish a Buckeye District judging uniform (e.g. blazer).

We will have an informal judges meeting at the spring conference to discuss these items.

Congratulations to Barb Zimmerman on becoming an accredited horticulture judge. We now have 52 accredited judges in the Buckeye District and three apprentices. Barb

encountered a problem with her accreditation, which unfortunately occurs more often than it should. After completing her five shows as an apprentice, she assumed that she would soon become accredited. Five months elapsed and still no word. She contacted me, and I made an inquiry of ARS headquarters. Only four apprentice reports had been submitted by her supervising judges. When reminded, the delinquent judge promptly sent in his report. Twenty-three years ago, when I was an apprentice, two of my mentoring judges failed to send in reports on me even when reminded. Thus, I did seven shows. It is irresponsible for us as accredited judges to fail to send in apprentice reports. If we feel that an apprentice need more than five shows before becoming accredited, then we should say so. If we think an apprentice will make a poor judge, we should express that opinion in our report. A pocket

veto is not fair to the apprentice or to the judging program.

I am the chairman of horticulture judges for the ARS National Miniature Rose Show in Columbus on July 13<sup>th</sup> and the Buckeye District Fall Rose Show in Marion on September 21<sup>st</sup>. If you wish to be considered for a judging assignment for either or both of these shows please submit your request to me in writing.

Finally, in this Bulletin you will find a preliminary schedule and registration form for the Top Gun Meeting in Findlay on Saturday, July 27<sup>th</sup>. Bob Showing Good Roses Martin will be our guest speaker, and you won't want to miss him.

Look forward to seeing you at the spring meeting in Columbus.

## **“Year of the Rose – 2002” Looking Ahead**

Now is the time to evaluate where your society is and their plans in meeting the challenge of promoting the rose during the Year of the Rose (YOTR) 2002.

When you explore your opportunities for publicity in your community, consider promoting your Rose Society with a gracious invitation to join. During your publicity venture be sure to let garden clubs, arboretums, and local nurseries know that you are available to share your knowledge of our favorite flower, the rose, which is our national floral emblem. Do you have a personal story relating your passion for the rose that you can share? Consider doing a program on highly disease resistant roses. Many gardeners will be willing to place roses in their landscape if they can do so without the scheduled spraying program. Meet with the consulting rosarians in your society and develop a story that will introduce the novice to roses. Outline a “Grow a Rose” program that implies

how easy it is to grow a rose. Follow this with your phone number to call for consultation as needed. Do you have a neighbor who is growing roses but has not joined a society because he/she has never been invited? Extend an invitation to him/her and share your rose growing experiences. Is your garden open to local citizens on a scheduled basis that they may come and view your roses and feel the pleasure you receive as you share your roses? Are you considering construction of a rose garden in your city park, or are you busy planning the refurbishing of an old established Rose Garden? Both offer the opportunity to publicize with a ceremony at the completion of the project. Invite local dignitaries to the party. They and the Press will be pleased to be included. Has your Mayor been invited to sign a Proclamation designating 2002 as The Year of the Rose? Send me a stamped self-addressed envelope and I will return it filled with a sample proclamation form that you may use or redesign to fit your

community. Ask your local paper to place within the gardening section the website of the American Rose Society, <http://www.ars.org> and the ARS YOTR website, <http://www.rose-2002.org> as you explain to them that this the Year of the Rose and the rose is our national flower.

Now that you have been given some suggestions to enrich your already blooming Year of the Rose – 2002 program we are asking you to share your ideas. Terri Lady, your District Director, would like you to share what you have accomplished and/or what you have in progress in the next Buckeye District Bulletin. I will be

happy to compile your stories/involvement into a format to fit the Buckeye District Bulletin. Send your present involvement and/or plans yet to be developed to:

Hosted by the Central Ohio Rose Society & The Columbus Rose Club, it will be held in the beautiful ballroom of the Holiday Inn Worthington - Columbus.

We will have a Welcome Reception on Friday evening, a great rose show, seminars and speakers including Art and Terry Emmons, Don & Mary Myers & Dr. Gary Rankin that you will enjoy on Saturday morning. The Saturday afternoon panel will include John Saville, Michael Williams, Judy Bell and a few others.

Saturday evening we will have our banquet in and around the roses with our Honore and keynote speaker, Dennis Bridges. We will be introducing a rose at the convention in honor of Dr. John Dickman. The Rose Gardens tour will be on Sunday.

The weekend will be packed full of great fellowship and seeing old acquaintances and making new friends.
