From the Director...

Spring got off to a rosy start with the first ever Heritage Rose Seminar. Attendees enjoyed a full day of presentations from OGR experts: Oline Reynolds from the Deep South District; Henry Rankin, Jon and Lois Wier, and Bunny Skran from the Great Lakes District; and Buckeye's George Meiling, Betty Fagerstrom, Jeff Imlay and Dr. Jim Hering. My sincere thanks to each of you for helping to make the seminar a success.

The following day, we had another full agenda for the Buckeye District Spring Meeting. Bunny Skran, guest speaker, gave an informative program on "Hardy and Disease Resistant Roses for the Mid-West". Dr. Susan Clingenpeel spoke on new miniatures and growing them in pots in "Pots and What's Hot". Moderator Dr. Jim Hering and his panel of experts including Tom Wood, Brian Burley, Dr. Paul Klinefelter and Jim Zimmerman answered questions on rose culture and Randy Lady presented the results of the first annual Buckeye District Slide Contest. Thank you to everyone

who participated in the meeting and especially Jim and Barbara Zimmerman for their fund raising efforts.

The Spring ARS Convention and Rose Show was held in San Jose, CA in late April. It was a good meeting and I was happy to see so many Buckeye rosarians attending this early convention. They included: Jim and Anne Hering, Steve and Betty Robinson, Gary Barlow, George Meiling, Lew Shupe, Randy and myself all made the trip. The Queen of the Show was 'Lynn Anderson', exhibited by Susan Chan McCarthy and the Miniature Queen of the Show, exhibited by Mike Becker, was 'X-Rated'.

At the Board of Director's business meeting a number of items were discussed and approved: 1) Three of the four ARS "specialty" bulletins will be phased out by the end of the year. They include the *Rose Arranger's Bulletin*, *Mini News* and *OGR & Shrub Gazette*. Articles that might have been included in these

discontinued bulletins will now appear in the *American Rose* magazine on a rotating basis. 2) A professional firm will be hired to assist in updating the ARS web site. 3) The board accepted two new trophies: the President's Trophy and the Garden Web Forum's "Best of Show" trophy. 4) As the board meeting neared its eleventh hour, the board voted to begin all Board Meetings by 9:00 a.m. Finally, a proposal to start immediate construction on the Klima Education and Visitors Center failed. Money would have to be borrowed to begin construction and the board felt it was unwise to incur additional debt at this time.

The Buckeye District recently lost two officers to other districts. Treasurer, Dr. Susan Clingenpeel has moved to Georgia; and Roses In Review Chairman, Lyman Johnson to South Carolina. Thanks to each of you for the superb job you did. I appreciate your hard work and support of the Buckeye District. Lori Hilfer will be taking over the treasurer's position and Stuart Schulman will chair the Roses In Review committee.

Please complete this year's Roses In Review forms (check the July 2002 issue of the *American Rose* magazine) and send them to your local society coordinator, or to the Buckeye District RIR Chair: Stuart Schulman, 12 E Sunnybrook Dr, Cincinnati, OH 45237. The completed forms should reach Stuart by September 26, 2002, so that he can begin the time consuming tallying process and submit results to ARS. Do it today before you forget!

The sixth annual Top Gun meeting will be held on Saturday, July 27, 2002, in Findlay. The meeting is sponsored by the Millstream Rose Society and will be held at the Findlay Inn & Conference Center. Our featured speaker will be Bob Martin, author of *Showing Good Roses*. On Friday night, prior to the meeting, a catered dinner will be held at the home of Larry and Cathy Schock. Arrangement Chair, Dr. Gary Barlow, will be conducting an arrangement seminar and workshop on August 3, 2002 at Franklin Park Conservatory. This workshop will focus on six types of Modern Arrangements: Modern Line, Transparency, Underwater, Reflective, Kinetic Abstract and Framed Spatial. The Buckeye District Fall Rose Show will be held in Marion, OH on September 20-22, 2002. ARS Vice President, Marilyn Wellan, will be our honored guest speaker. The 4th Annual National All-Miniature Rose Show and Convention was held in Columbus on July 12-14, 2002. A new miniature rose, 'Dr. John Dickman' was introduced at the convention by hybridizer, honoree and keynote speaker, Dennis Bridges. 'Cupcake' was added to the Hall of Fame winners and the 2003 AOE winners were announced. Congratulations to Brian and Jane Burley, recipients of a "Special Presidential Citation" awarded by ARS President Dr. Tommy Cairns. There were over 425 horticulture entries in the rose show in addition to 102 arrangements. Once again this year, 'Fairhope' was selected as Queen of the Show; it was exhibited by Bob and Sandy Lundberg. On Sunday, attendees visited the Columbus Park of Roses and the home gardens of Tom Herr, Dr. Paul Klinefelter and Dr. Jim and Anne Hering.

Buckeye Judges Corner

The Heritage Rose Seminar on April 6th was a huge success both from the number of rosarians attending and the quality of the program. Terri Lady deserves the lion's share of credit for organizing the seminar, and the faculty is to be complimented on the relevance and thoroughness of its presentations. Seventeen Buckeye District horticulture judges attended and received credit for their four-year audit requirement. There were seven judges from other districts who participated, most of them as faculty. Three Buckeye judges need to fulfill their audit requirement by the end of this year. Check the roster of Buckeye judges to see if you are one. Having a seminar in conjunction with the spring district meeting, like we did this year, seems to work very well. I will tentatively plan to schedule a judging seminar prior to next year's spring meeting.

In our district we currently have 52 accredited judges, three apprentice judges and eight emeritus judges. One of the 52 has submitted a request to go to emeritus status at the end of this year, and all three of the apprentices have nearly completed their required shows and should become accredited in 2002. Jon Wier, Chairman of Horticulture Judges in the Great Lakes District, and I would like to have a judging school at the combined Buckeye/Great Lakes District Conference in Toledo in September, 2003. In order to have a school, we must have judging candidates. Please contact me if you are interested in becoming a judge. In our district we have a number of outstanding exhibitors who would make excellent judges. Encourage them to join the judging ranks. Being a judge does not preclude one from continuing to be an exhibitor—in fact we strongly recommend it.

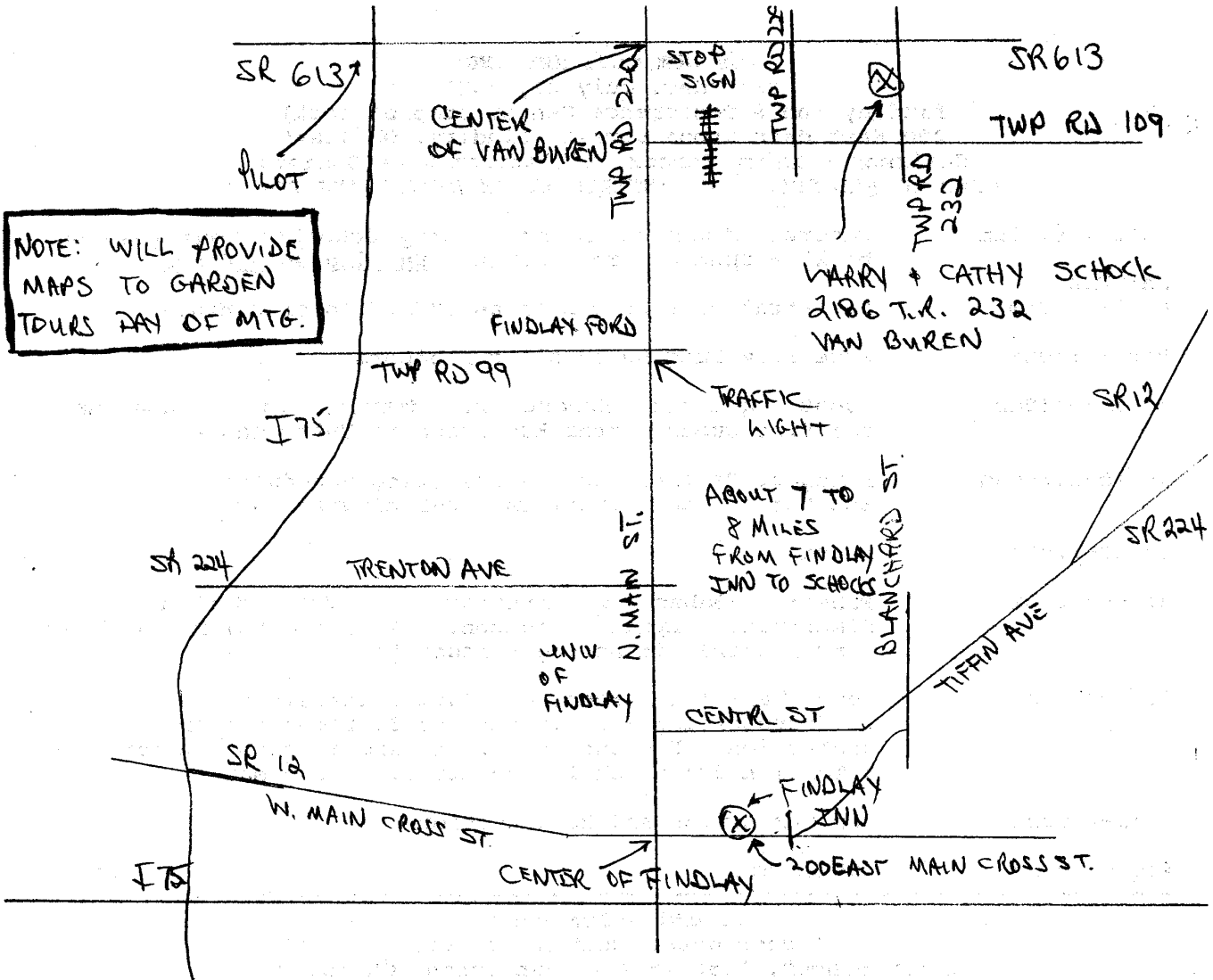
As you know, judges are required to submit an annual report and expected to participate in Roses in Review each year. I have received reports for last year from 49 of our 52 judges. Thank you for your cooperation and your suggestions. Now is the time to complete your RIR evaluations, either electronically or by report form.

Anne and I have participated in judging the rose trials in Europe for the past three years – Italy (Rome and Monza) in 2000 and 2002 and Bagatelle (Paris), Baden-Baden (Germany) and Geneva in 2001. I would enjoy giving a program to your local society about the European trials.

The Top Gun Club meeting in Findlay is upon us. It is Saturday, July 27th, and a registration form is enclosed with this bulletin. Bob Martin (Pasadena, CA) is our guest speaker. You don't want to miss Bob, especially if you are an exhibitor or a judge.

The Buckeye District Fall Rose Show and Conference will be in Marion, September 21st and 22nd. Marilyn Wellan, ARS Vice President, will be our featured speaker and will update us on the Year of the Rose – 2002 celebration and the future of the American Rose Society from her perspective. The theme for the Fall Conference is "Celebrating Ohio and the Year of the Rose – 2002". (Next year is Ohio's bicentennial.) The Garden Club of Marion, host society of the fall conference, invites you to come to Marion in September and bring roses. Registration form is enclosed with this bulletin.

ARS ROSE ARRANGEMENT SEMINAR

A Rose Arrangement Seminar, approved by the American Rose Society, will be held on Saturday, August 3, 2002, at the Franklin Park Conservatory, 1777 East Broad Street, Columbus, Ohio. The seminar will cover Modern Arrangements, and the focus will be on six types of modern designs: 1) Modern Line; 2) Transparency; 3) Underwater; 4) Reflective; 5) Kinetic Abstract; and 6) Framed Spatial. The morning session will feature four arrangers who will teach the seminar: Gary Barlow, Bill Carlson, Gladys Johnson and Lew Shupe.

Following a morning demonstration by the instructors, the afternoon will feature work sessions where each participant will design arrangements. Because of the time limitations, each participant will select two of the six designs to work on, although he/she will see all six types constructed and evaluated. Exhibit and critiques will close the afternoon session.

Information on materials and supplies needed for each of the six designs (and specifically, the two he/she has selected) will be sent to registrants at a later date. Some line materials will be provided. Participants are encouraged to bring container(s), line material and roses, plus any other materials desired.

For those judges who need to build credits, six hours of audit credit will be given for the seminar. This is a good opportunity to brush up on your skills! Come join us. Gardener Dubbed a Real Rose

A rose by any other name might smell as sweet, but perhaps not to John Dickman of Upper Arlington.

He is the honoree in the naming of a new rose – Dr. John Dickman – to be introduced in 2004 by Bridges Miniature Roses of Lawndale, NC.

Rose breeders Dennis and Suzy Bridges are recognizing Dickman's work educating gardeners about roses.

The announcement of the rose naming was to come last night at the American Rose Society's miniature rose convention, which

continues today at the Holiday Inn at I-270 and Rt. 23 in Worthington.

For almost a dozen years, Dickman has been answering growers' questions in the American Rose Society's magazine, sent to the 22,000-plus members.

He is also a former president of both the Central Ohio Rose Society and the Columbus Rose Club.

"We think he's a real gentleman and has done a lot for roses," Suzy Bridges said.

"He has educated so many people."

Dennis Bridges praised Dickman's integrity, knowledge and the thoroughness with which he answered questions in his column.

"I'm highly honored that a hybridizer wants to pick me out," said Dickman, a medical biochemist retired from Chemical Abstracts Service.

His tutoring abilities came naturally. Dickman taught high-school chemistry a few years before serving in the Army in Korea.

Dickman began growing roses in 1967, when he and his wife, Sue, planted a half dozen to add color to a new fence.

The Dickmans soon joined the American Rose Society to learn more about roses. They eventually became show judges.

They grow about 80 roses, down from a peak of 250.

The new rose started life as a seed produced from a cross between two roses.

Seeds are sown in a greenhouse at Christmas and the new plants flower the following spring, Suzy Bridges said.

While the breeder immediately knows the color and growth habit, other characteristics, such as hardiness, are observed over a period of several years before the rose is deemed worthy for market.

Plants are propagated by cuttings, a process that takes several years to produce enough bushes to sell.

Dr. John Dickman the rose sports 1 ½- 2-inch deep lavender flowers on a plant that grows about 24 inches tall. It's a miniflora, a rose with characteristics of miniatures and larger floribundas.

"I think it's a very nice rose," said Dickman. Still, he wonders how well it will sell.

"I don't think the name will seem that romantic."
