Buckeye Judges' Corner

The seventh annual ARS National Miniature Rose Conference in Indianapolis July 8-10 was a great success. One of our judges, Lauren Toth, won both of the ARS national arrangement challenge classes, the Ralph Moore Trophy and the Ben Williams Trophy. Congratulations Lauren!

The eighth annual Top Gun Meeting was held in Youngstown July 22 & 23. It was hosted by the Mahoning Valley Rose Society and chaired by Dick Anthony and Pat Martinec. The Fellows Riverside Gardens and Visitor Center was a wonderful setting for a rose meeting. David Clemons gave informative and stimulating talks on his experiences in hybridizing, and his newest introduction, **Whirlaway**, was auctioned at the end of the meeting. The queens from the Top Gun Rose Show were: HT- **Mavrik** by Dave Ackers; Min-Fl – **Regina Lee** by Jim Hering; Min – **Nancy Jean** by Jim Zimmerman. Thanks to the Mahoning Valley Rose Society for being great hosts. The 2006 Top Gun Meeting will be in Columbus.

The Great Lakes District will host a horticulture judging school in September. Contact Terri Lady (rlady@earthlink.net) or Jon Wier (jonwier@aol.com). There are several judging issues which have come to my attention this year and deserve comment.

1. Disqualification – From the *Guidelines and Rules for Judging Roses*: “Judges must never disqualify an entry unless they are very sure of the disqualification....If there is any question about the certainty of an offense, a judge must never disqualify a specimen.”

Stem-on-Stem: “Only if a judge suspects the presence of this condition, may he/she carefully lift the specimen from the vase by its stem to verify the disqualification.” In one of the National Rose Shows this year the trophy winning miniature spray was disqualified on the way to the trophy table after the final judging because to the chairman of judges, it appeared to be stem-on-stem. The exhibitor had used a piece of stem for a wedge (all wedging material was allowed). The chairman of judges failed to lift the specimen from the vase, and the entry was sent back with “DQ’d – Stem-on-Stem” on the entry tag. When the show opened, I checked the specimen by removing it from the vase, and there was a normal stem. This should never happen in a local show, much less a district or national show.

2. Form – The *Guidelines* state: “...a bud is that stage of development having the sepals fully separated and folded down to the peduncle, the petals just beginning the slightest unfurling...” In many rose shows, local, district and national, miniature roses in one bloom per stem classes and especially challenge classes are reaching the trophy table with sepals fully up. These roses are not even buds yet by definition. Exhibition roses must have the sepals down, and it is our responsibility as judges to insist that winning roses meet the standards of form.

3. Balance and Proportion – Ten or fifteen years ago long stems were the vogue for hybrid teas in national shows. More recently, we have seen excessively long stems on miniature and mini-flora entries. The *Guidelines* do not instruct us to give extra points for extra inches of stem. Rather, they urge us to reward “an aesthetically pleasing exhibit” with “a proper relationship” between the length of stem and the size of the bloom. Balance and proportion requires a value judgment; this makes judging an art.

4. The Court – In many rose shows, after the Queen, King and Princess, a court of attendants is selected in no particular order. Until recently I thought this was acceptable, and it certainly speeds up the judging process. However, for the exhibitor and especially for the viewing public it is helpful for the judges to place the court numerically (eg. 4th, 5th, 6th and 7th). It takes a little longer, but it can usually be performed by a show of hands rather than secret ballot. Most exhibitors want to know specifically where we rank their roses.

5. Ethics – Constructive discussions are important parts of team judging. We should,

however, avoid any tendency to dominate other members of our team when judging classes. When we are balloting on the court, all verbal evaluation of the roses under consideration should be terminated and attempts to influence our fellow judges are not appropriate. If there is an impasse in the voting, then discussion of the attributes and faults of the candidates is proper and helpful. And remember, NEVER TOUCH THE BLOOM!

I look forward to seeing you at the District Show in Columbus in September.

Consulting Rosarian Update

PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO THE BYLAWS OF THE BUCKEYE DISTRICT OF THE AMERICAN ROSE SOCIETY

ARTICLE IV – MANAGEMENT

Section 12. The district treasurer shall maintain bank accounts in the name of the American Rose Society, Buckeye District. All funds received shall be directly deposited into those accounts. All funds shall be drawn upon by one signature, the treasurer. All expenditures, other than those for payment of district mailings, publications, or awards, shall be made pursuant to a budget approved by a majority of the board of officers. The treasurer shall provide to the treasurer of the American Rose Society such financial information as may be requested.
