From the Director...

The 2001 rose growing season may be over, but the tremendous success of the ARS Fall National Convention is still fresh in my mind. The long hours of planning by General Chairmen Bob and Virginia Choate, John and Diane Jamison, Scott and MJ Bailey, and Show Co-Chairmen Peter and Susan Schneider were evident, and my sincere thanks to each of them for their dedication and commitment. Special thanks must also be given to the members of The Forest City and The Western Reserve Rose Societies as well as the numerous others who were involved with the planning and execution of the convention and show.

At the ARS Board of Director's Meeting held on Friday of the convention, a number of items were discussed and approved. Highlights include: 1) Region 0 Director, Mike Lowe, obtained a grant for the purchase of a color laser printer for ARS headquarters. 2) President, Dr. Tommy Cairns received a number of letters from rose societies around the world after the September 11, 2001 tragedy. Tommy's response can be found elsewhere in this bulletin. ARS has also declared September 11th as "Rose Day of Remembrance". 3) The audit schedule for Arrangement Judges was reduced from six to four years. 4) District Consulting Rosarian Chairs were granted "read only" access to the ARS Consulting Rosarian database. 5) The Gulf District will sponsor a David Austin display garden at the American Rose Center.

A number of Buckeye rosarians found their exhibits on the trophy table when the rose show opened its doors, they included: Barbara

& Jim Zimmerman, David & Lois Ackers, Lyman & Carolyn Johnson, Tim Hartranft, Dr. Glenn Beck, John Jamison, William & Anita Solarz, Dick Seibold, Dr. Bruce LeRoy & Dr. Susan Clingenpeel, Dr. Gary Barlow, Vince DiCillo, Lauren Toth, Brian Burley, Mary Kathryn Fraser, Sue Witwer, Cathie Pruden, and Randy & myself. At the banquet, Gary Barlow received the first Betty Pavey Trophy for a modern arrangement. Also at the banquet, three Buckeye rosarians were honored with ARS Presidential Citations: Dr. John Dickman, George Meiling and Bob Choate.

At the Buckeye District Business Meeting, the following officers were approved for the coming year: President – Steve Pyrak, 1st Vice President – Jim Zimmerman, 2nd Vice President – Larry Schock, Secretary – Denise Mraz, and Treasurer – Dr. Susan Clingenpeel. My thanks to Past President, Brian Burley, for a job well done. District members voted for the purposed Buckeye District Perpetual Trophy honoring hybridizer, Griffith Buck. The award will be presented for the first time at next year's fall district rose show.

The Silver Honor Medal, presented by Anne Hering, was awarded to Gladys Johnson. Dr. Jim Hering presented The Outstanding Judge's Award to Dr. Lew Shupe, and the Outstanding Consulting Rosarian was awarded to Tren Meyer. I presented District Director Citations for outstanding service for 2001 to Jim and Barbara Zimmerman, The Forest City Rose Society, and The Western Reserve Rose Society. A most deserved congratulations to all these outstanding Buckeye Rosarians.

The "Year of the Rose – 2002" celebration is about to begin. I hope that by now each local society has a calendar of events planned to promote our national flower, the rose. This is an excellent opportunity to educate the public and gain new members in our societies. The ARS/Home Depot Program is in its final stages of preparation; Steve Pyrak will be contacting participating CRs with more information. YOTR Chair, Peg Newill has been working with local society contacts to develop plans for the yearlong event, and Dr. Jim Hering with the help of Randy Lady has finished the YOTR slide presentation. Local societies are encouraged to publish information and pictures of activities on the district website www.buckeyerose.com.

It is time to join, or renew, as a Patron of the Buckeye District for 2002. This program supports our on-going efforts and helps to build a reserve that may be used for special projects. Saturday morning will begin bright and early with the rose show. We are putting together a full and challenging schedule for all mini rose exhibitors and arrangers. Remember, mini roses are easy to bring when traveling.

While judging is proceeding, attendees may take part in a full day of seminars and presentations. Some of these will be educational, some will be question and answer sessions, and others will be just for fun.

The awards banquet will be held Saturday evening to honor the show winners of the day

along with the 2002 Mini Hall of Fame winners and 2003 Award of Excellence winners. Of course, the evening will conclude with lively socializing and discussion of the show and mini roses.

Sunday will conclude the convention with a garden tour of some of the best gardens in central Ohio. First will be the Columbus Park of Roses, which features more than 10,000 roses. Sadly, most of these are not miniatures. We will then proceed to some of the best gardens of miniature rose growers and exhibitors in Ohio. We should be back to the hotel by mid-afternoon to start the journey home.

Buckeye Judges Corner

The highest honor for a judge in the Buckeye District is the Outstanding Judge Award. At the District Meeting in Cleveland in September the Award for 2001 was presented to Dr. Lew Shupe, our former District Chairman of Arrangement Judges and currently the ARS National Chairman of Arrangements Judging. Congratulate Lew when you see him. There are currently fifty one (51) Accredited, four (4) Apprentice and eight (8) Emeritus Horticulture Judges in the Buckeye District. The newest Accredited Judge is Tom Rubins; congratulations Tom, we will put you to work.

To maintain our judging accreditation we must each submit an "Annual Judges Report" and attend a judging seminar at least once every four years. We are encouraged to continue to grow and exhibit roses, to be active judges (at least five shows every three years) and to participate in Roses in Review each year by submitting a report. Your "Annual Judges Report" form for 2001 is enclosed with this Bulletin; we had 100% participation last year, keep it up! Seven of our Accredited Judges are due to attend a judging seminar by the end of this year (see the enclosed judges list for your audit year).

Once we become accredited, the key to maintaining our judging skills is continuing education. Most of the items listed in the previous paragraph are part of continuing ed. – including growing new varieties and reporting them in RIR. Our District does an excellent job of offering us educational opportunities, and I shall list some that are upcoming. I hope you will take advantage of them.

1. Consulting Rosarian Seminar – 2/23/02 (Franklin Park, Columbus) Judges are usually C.R.'s, but even if you are not, this seminar will help you as a judge and an exhibitor.
2. Old Garden Rose Seminar – 4/6/02 (Franklin Park, Columbus) This seminar is being held in conjunction with the Buckeye District Spring Meeting (seminar – Sat.; district meeting – Sun.). The two-featured speakers are Oline Reynolds, ARS Region 3 Director from Bainbridge, Georgia, and our own George Meiling, past ARS Treasurer. For Buckeye District Accredited Judges attending this seminar, the seminar will satisfy the four-year judging audit requirement.
3. ARS National Miniature Rose Show and Conference – 7/12-14/02 (Holiday Inn at Crosswoods, Worthington) As Chairman of Judges, I will need judges for the show – watch for notices in *American Rose* and *Buckeye Bulletin*. Dennis Bridges will be our banquet speaker.
4. Top Gun Meeting #6 – 7/27/02 (Findlay – Millstream R.S. host) Top Gun is about exhibiting, but it is the right stuff for judges as well. We've had some dandy speakers the past four years – Ballins, Tucker, Hefner and LeMire (none the first year) – and this year's speaker, Bob Martin, Editor of *Rose Exhibitors Forum*, from Pasadena, CA has impeccable credentials. Bob is the author of a new book, *Showing Good Roses (A Complete Exhibitors Guide)* which I highly recommend to all

- rosarians; but especially to exhibitors and judges. Don't miss this meeting!
5. Buckeye District Fall Conference and Rose Show – 9/20-22/02 (Marion – Garden Club of Marion host) As Chairman of Judges, I will be inviting judges from other districts to judge our show but will also accept Buckeye Judges. Watch for notice in BB. Our

guest speaker will be Marilyn Wellan, ARS Vice President and National Chairman of “Year of the Rose – 2002”, from Colfax, Louisiana.

Winter 2001 Report: Rose Arrangements

The Betty Pavey National Arrangement Award

ARS Rose Show, Cleveland, 2001

The “Betty Pavey *Say It With Roses* Trophy for Modern Arrangements” was introduced, and awarded for the first time, at the recent national conference and rose show of The American Rose Society. This national award honors Betty Pavey who, along with her husband Hugh ‘Doc’ Pavey, were life-long residents of Xenia and were both avid rose growers, consulting rosarians, exhibitors and active in the Buckeye District for many years. Betty held many elected positions in local, state and national rose societies, including Buckeye District Director, and the ARS national chairperson of arrangements. She was a recipient of the prestigious American Rose Society Gold Medal for her work at the national level. Her book *Say It With Roses* was a major reference for flower arrangers, and was a basis for the current American Rose Society judging manual.

Members of the Pavey family traveled to Cleveland, Ohio to be part of the award ceremony at the convention banquet. Judy Pavey L’Amoureux, of Arlington Heights,

Illinois (daughter of Doc and Betty) presented the award, assisted by Dr. Lew Shupe, national ARS arrangement chair. Suzanne L’Amoureux (granddaughter) also from Arlington Heights, and Betty’s sister Patricia and her husband James Crawfis of Mansfield, Ohio, also attended.

The recipient of this award was Dr. Gary Barlow of Fairborn, Ohio, past District Director, and currently the Buckeye District Arrangement Chair. His design was a modern style vertical arrangement using a metal sculpture, driftwood, vertical foliage and ‘Suffolk’ and ‘Louise Estes’ roses.

The trophy will be presented once a year throughout the various regions in the United States, honoring the top modern challenge class arrangement in the American Rose Society sanctioned rose shows. This award will next be presented in the North/South Carolina District in 2002.

She will send these suggestions to all the YOTR chairs within the Buckeye District.

For the beginner we need to help them. 1. Choose hardy, disease resistant roses for their first venture. 2. Discuss rose culture in simple terms. 3. Offer organic gardening solutions for those who prefer to continue to use this method of arboricultural. 4. Review a list of roses that will enhance their home landscape and placement in the microclimate available in their yard. 5. If fragrance is a priority in their landscape, then give them a list of roses to plant to meet this need. 6. Bust most important of all is to LISTEN and give them an answer in as

simple a format as possible to encourage their participation in growing our favorite flower, the rose.

Do you remember the Buckeye District Certificate that requires a library exhibit featuring “The Year of the Rose – 2002”? Take your photos and send me (Peg Newill address below) a brief description describing how it was developed – was it a club project – did you gain new members – and the page or pages where the public signed as having viewed it. Clubs who receive certificates will be listed in the Spring 2003 *Buckeye Rose Bulletin* and their photos displayed at the Fall 2002 Buckeye District meeting. Member clubs that construct or refurbish a community Rose Garden will also be candidates for a certificate. Dr. Gary Barlow will direct this project throughout Region 4. Send Gary a picture of the Rose Garden and a brief write up on its impact in the community.

Review the Buckeye Time Line for involvement as listed on the Buckeye web site: www.buckeyerose.com. Ask your local society YOTR chairperson for a copy of this list if e-mail is not easily available to you.

This opportunity is a gift to your club so open it and make it grow. What your club reaps will far exceed the effort put forth by your members and the rose world will be richer because of your participation.

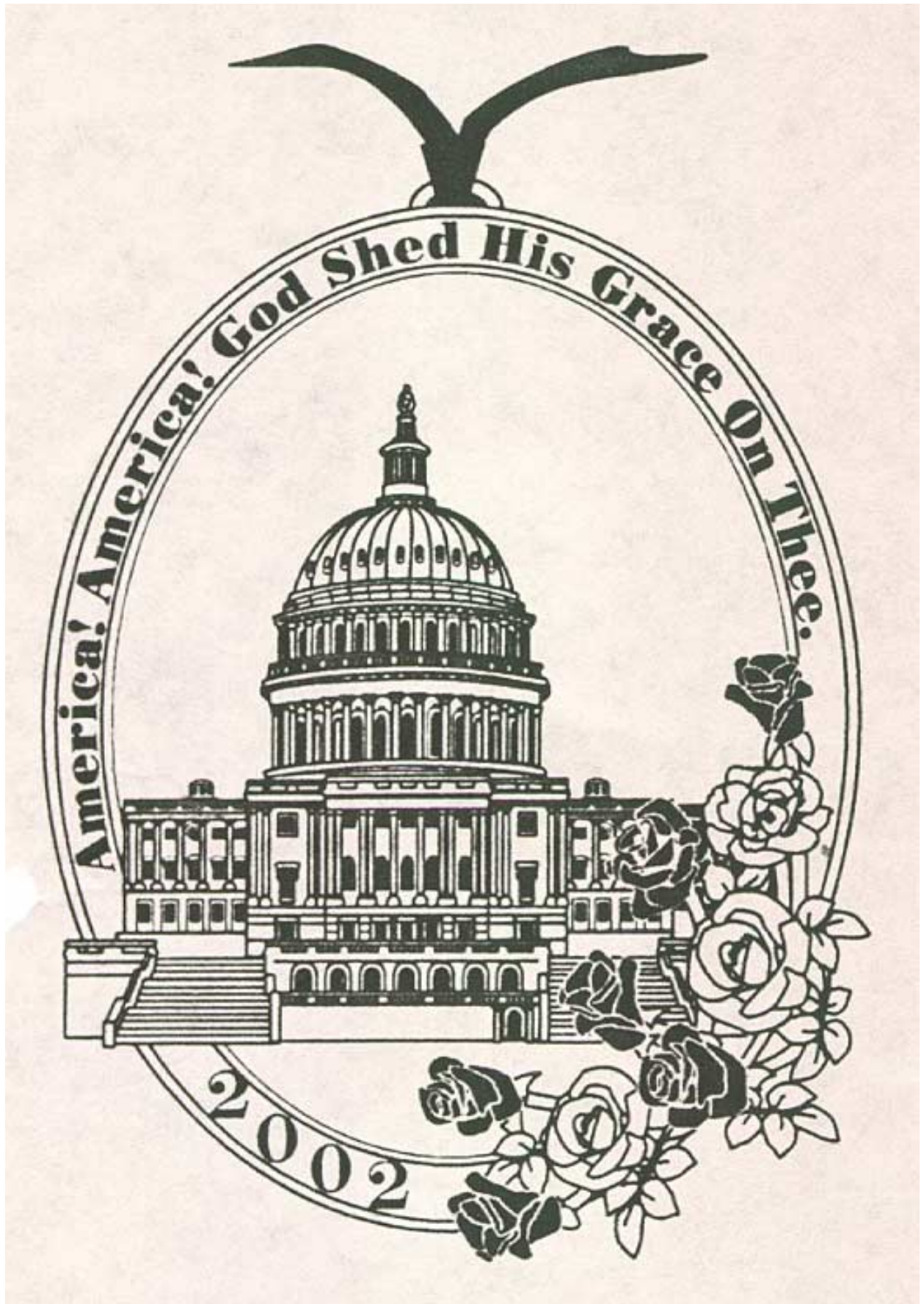
